Dear Friends,

*What a glorious celebration it was! I know I speak for all of us when I say how proud I was of our youth this past Sunday. They sang, played instruments, read, wrote prayers, served as acolytes, ushers, and greeters, preached...they did it all. Our hearts were warmed, our spirits were lifted, and God was praised. Thanks to all of our youth for their leadership, our top-notch Sunday School teachers for helping them prepare, Jenn Bearup for bringing out their musical gifts, and their parents and grandparents who bring them to church each week so they can be nurtured in the faith. We'd catch a few fireflies, drop some grass and leaves in, put the lid on, and leave them on the kitchen counter as we reluctantly went to bed, hoping that maybe this year they would live through the night (they never did). I sat there remembering our joy and wonder over the fireflies, the hot, humid summer days and nights in Richmond, my grandmother's cooking (biscuits with redeye country ham, Watergate salad, chicken and dumplings, watermelon rind pickles, yellow cake with chocolate fudge frosting), my grandfather's stories, my cousins and aunts and uncles, and how young my sisters and my parents and I all were. Bittersweet memories, mostly sweet, and they filled me with gratitude for the gift of summer, family, and life itself.*

*Whatever your plans are, I hope you have some moments like this over these summer months, times of connection with memories, with family and friends, with the beauty and wonder of creation, moments that remind you of all of God's blessings and fill you with joy and gratitude. May you be rested and restored, stay cool, and enjoy this gift of life.*




**Plaque buildup can lead to heart disease, stroke and aneurysm**

# MAY FINANCIAL REPORT

6/27/18

Good news... The Endowment account has increased \$1,189.02. Our checking and savings accounts are in good shape.

## Income:

Pledges are up 2.55% to 102.67% of Budget- Thank you for keeping up with your pledges. I ask that you try to remember pledge payments before going away for vacation. National grid does not take a vacation. Thank you! Non-Pledge is down a little to 392.58% of Budget. It is still above what we normally see at this time of the year. Budgeted income from all sources is \$82,862.55 thru May 31<sup>st</sup> our actual income is at \$ 96,565.51.



## Income highlights:

Parish use is at 159.82% of budget. Food Sense is at 124.98% of budget. We only earn a small amount with each transaction but the program helps many. The winner is Outreach Projects at 932.39% of budget. The Giving Boutique has been the main contributor to this account. Also, the income from bottles and cans has also helped.

## Expenses:

We ended the first five months with a surplus (more income than expenses) of \$ 3,692.36, down from last month. Not surprised with the lowering of the surplus. It will continue as we bring all the new benefits on board for our new priest.

Some unexpected expense has put Church Repairs, Gift giving and Grounds Expense over budget rather early this year. I don't see any of the other expenses being near to going over their annual budget.

So let's look at the Fund Raising accounts...Revenue vs. Expenses (January – May)

Church Dinners - Has a surplus of \$1,318.82

Community Garden – Has surplus of \$1,207.37

Operating expenses that have Revenue accounts to help offset.

Flowers – Has a surplus of \$434.

Votive Candles – Has not received any Revenue this year so that account is in the red -\$146.

Coffee – Has a surplus of \$80.63.

Blessing of the Backpacks – has received Revenue but has no expenses.

Community dinners – has had more expenses than revenue but we do currently have grant money to cover these expenses.

Samaritan Center – It has not received any Revenue that is specific to the Samaritan Center. But some of the Outreach Revenue will be use to cover this expense. The Samaritan Center is one of the Giving Boutique's projects.
